William Wordsworth

A Founding Father of Romanticism

Celebrate one of the most influential British poets in history as William Wordsworth takes his rightful place on an official UK coin for the very first time.

Revered in literary circles as a pioneer of English Romanticism, William Wordsworth is widely regarded as one of the most popular English-language poets of all time. As an influential figure that helped shape the literature of the time, The Royal Mint celebrates this iconic British poet on the 250th anniversary of his birth with a commemorative £5 coin.

The first official UK coin dedicated to Wordsworth features one of his most iconic lines – ‘Nature never did betray the heart that loved her’ – taken from the poem ‘Lines Written a Few Miles Above Tintern Abbey’. In keeping with the verse, the visual backdrop of the coin provides further depth to these words, depicting the mountainous landscape and familiar lakes that inspired him.

Available as a gold Proof, silver Proof and Brilliant Uncirculated edition, this commemorative coin truly encapsulates the spirit of Wordsworth and the essence of his work in a single design.

Our Innovation in Science series continues with the Rosalind Franklin 50p coin.

Born in London on 25 July 1920, Rosalind Franklin went on to become one of the most significant scientists in British history, possessing a brilliant mind and an exceptional work ethic.

Best known for her contribution to the scientific understanding of DNA, her groundbreaking research led to breakthroughs in multiple fields. Meanwhile, her vast subject knowledge also made her a world authority on the chemical structure of viruses, as well as coal and graphite.

Tragically, Franklin was diagnosed with cancer in 1956. Unwavering in her commitment until the end, she passed away less than two years later at the age of just 37. Coinciding with what would have been her 100th birthday, The Royal Mint is proud to honour this gifted trailblazer on a UK coin for the very first time.

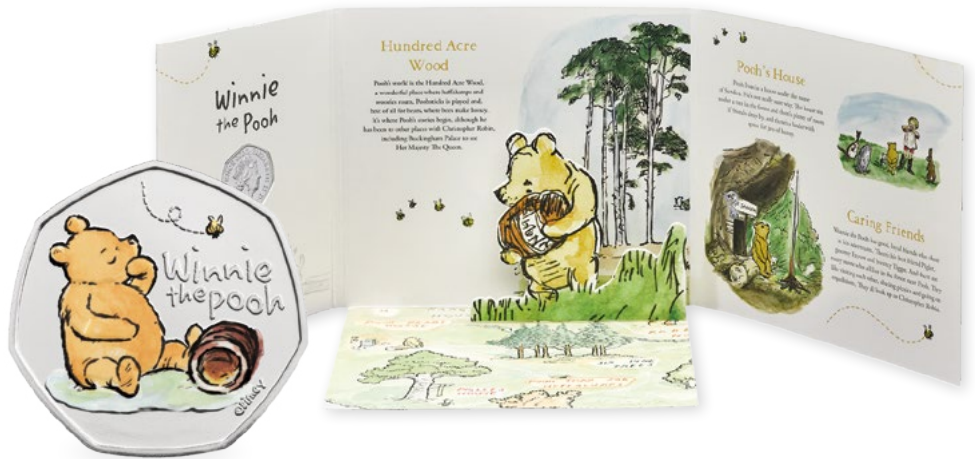

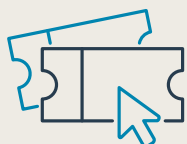

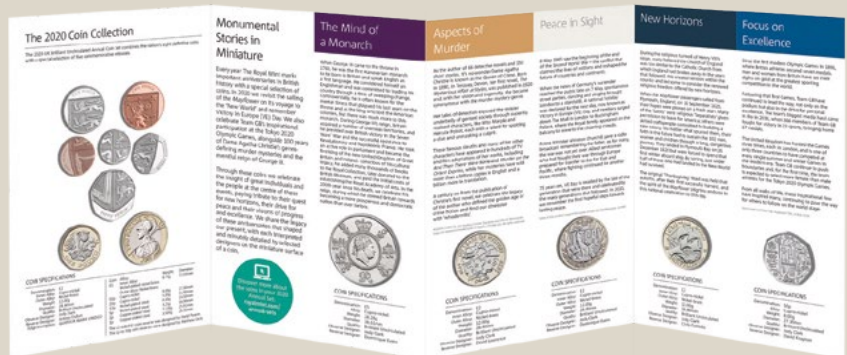

The Changing Face of Coinage

In an effort to take you inside the coin-making process, we take a rare glimpse at the art of coin design through an exclusive interview with The Royal Mint's Chief Engraver, Gordon Summers.

Serving in the position of Chief Engraver since 2008, Gordon has been at the helm of some of the most important coin developments of the last decade, including the latest definitive portrait of Her Majesty The Queen, which was the first to be modelled digitally. His expertise has helped shape the way we design coins and his experience has been invaluable, particularly during difficult times like the COVID-19 pandemic. We recently sat down with Gordon to discuss his career, life at The Royal Mint, and the changing face of coinage.

You've served as Chief Engraver at The Royal Mint for over a decade. What does a typical day look like for you?

Every day is different. I am currently working with teams to develop the future capabilities at The Royal Mint. With advancements in minting technology, there are great opportunities to develop our techniques using coin production processes we would have been unable to consider even a few years ago. This high-tech approach is balanced with an understanding of the traditional skills and craftsmanship applied to coins and medals. One day I might be part of an ideas session on future developments in the morning and then handworking a plaster model in the afternoon.

What would you say is the most difficult part of the coin-making process?

For me, the most challenging part is anticipating how small changes in design and tooling may affect its performance at the press. We have lots of historical data and



mathematical models to work with but there is still an intuitive aspect. With often lengthy development times, there is always a build-up of anticipation before we test a technique at a coin trial. That 'will it/won't it work' moment after several weeks or months of lead time can be a nerve-racking experience.

What was your job when you started at The Royal Mint and what did it entail?

I started working at The Royal Mint as a trainee engraver in 1992. It was a number of years before I was fully 'let loose' on master tools. One of my first tasks was to make individual

number punches for redating master tools. This was all done by hand – carving the tips of the punches and then hardening and tempering them with a blowtorch.

What tools and machinery that were vital back then have become virtually obsolete in The Royal Mint of 2020?

The basic process of striking coins hasn't really changed for hundreds of years, perhaps only the way the forces are generated: from hand hammering through water, steam and electrical power to hydraulics. All designs started with hand sketches, sculpted as plaster

or clay models, which are reproduced as copper electro-forms and then reduced to coin size on mechanical pantograph machines. We used the classic Janvier reducing machines into the new millennium!

What's the biggest difference between the coin production methods back then and the methods used today?

I think the major change in my time has been in the development of tooling through the introduction of digital techniques in the mid-1990s. We had to learn a new vocabulary with phrases like digital scanning, computer-aided design (CAD), computer numerical control (CNC), etc. We also needed to change how

we talked about detail. When I started at The Royal Mint, we measured in thousandths of an inch. Now we use microns or even fractions of microns – measurements equivalent to less than one-hundredth of the thickness of a human hair.

What do you consider the biggest innovation in coin engraving over the last 30 years?

Lasers have probably had the greatest impact on what we can do in terms of accuracy, repeatability and speed, and hence with visible security features. We can now produce features too small to be seen by the human eye but which can have a visible effect. Micro and even nano-features can affect how light is reflected

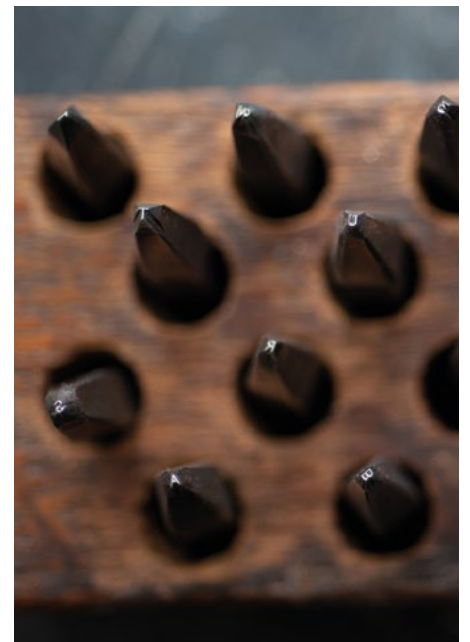
or refracted from a metal surface opening up possibilities which were previously out of reach.

Outside of technology, what are the main differences you've noticed between The Royal Mint of today versus The Royal Mint of yesterday?

I think the major change came about when The Royal Mint was 'vested' from the Civil Service. Before this time, there was a reliance on an established view of who our customers were and what they wanted from us. After this time, we set about actively discovering what our customers want and desire, and then committed to develop to meet their needs. This has resulted in an environment of continuous improvement and innovation.



Despite beginning his career at The Royal Mint in 1992, it was several years before Gordon had amassed the skills and experience to use specialist master tools.



With continued advancements in minting technology, today's coin design process is notably more sophisticated than the techniques used even just a few years ago.

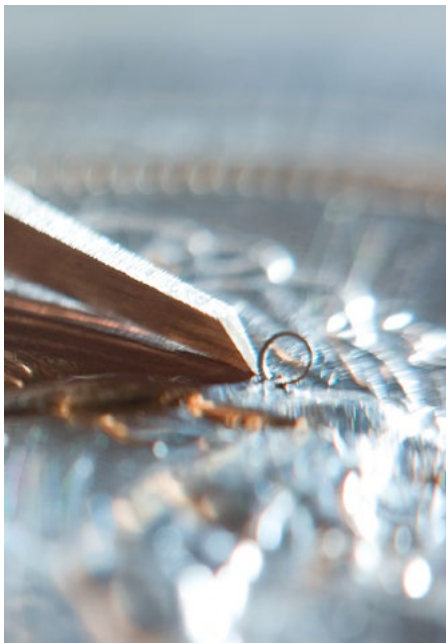


You have a reputation for innovation and problem-solving; what are some of the typical issues and roadblocks that you have to overcome in the design/production process?

I think one of the fundamental barriers to innovation is inertia – changing direction requires energy and effort. The easiest route is often to nudge, tweak or add to a process, which can make things more complex and harder to change, not to mention providing diminishing returns. After all, we would never have got to the Moon by breeding faster horses!

What have been the biggest challenges faced by your department during the pandemic and how have you overcome these obstacles?

I think there is no more powerful tool for invention than a group of people getting together to bounce ideas off each other. Naturally, the restrictions put in place throughout the pandemic, from lockdown to social distancing, have impacted the way in which we communicate. Fortunately, technology has allowed us to remotely communicate in ways that we would never have thought possible even a few years ago. That being said, to my mind, there is no true substitute for direct human contact.



What would you say has been your finest hour over the last 12 years since taking the position of Chief Engraver?

One of the joys of my job is being able to work with a wider team to produce something amazing – my individual contribution is less important. For this reason, I'd have to say that being part of the team that developed and produced the London 2012 Olympic medals was an outstanding time, particularly when I had the privilege of watching a few of those same medals being awarded at the actual Games.

What makes The Royal Mint the premier producer of coinage in the world?

I think it boils down to three main attributes: our long history, which gives us stability and a reputation for reliability and security, our people with vast amounts of experience, talent and dedication, and our commitment to satisfy our customers' needs and exceed their expectations. It's why we've been around for more than 1,100 years and why we're considered the very best.





The Tower of London's Wild History

Following on from the release of the White Tower coin earlier this year, the second coin in The Tower of London 2020 collection centres around one of the most curious aspects of the site's storied past – the Royal Menagerie.

Famed for its collection of rare and exotic animals, the Royal Menagerie was founded in the medieval era and was considered to be London's first zoo. All housed within the infamous Tower of London walls, the extraordinary collective of creatures remains a fascinating part of the Tower's history.

The remarkable story of the menagerie is retold through an original design by heraldic artist Timothy Noad – the man behind all four designs in the 2020 collection. The coin itself fittingly features the three Lions of England, reinforcing its regal nature while also acknowledging the fact that lions were believed to be the first animals to arrive at the Tower.

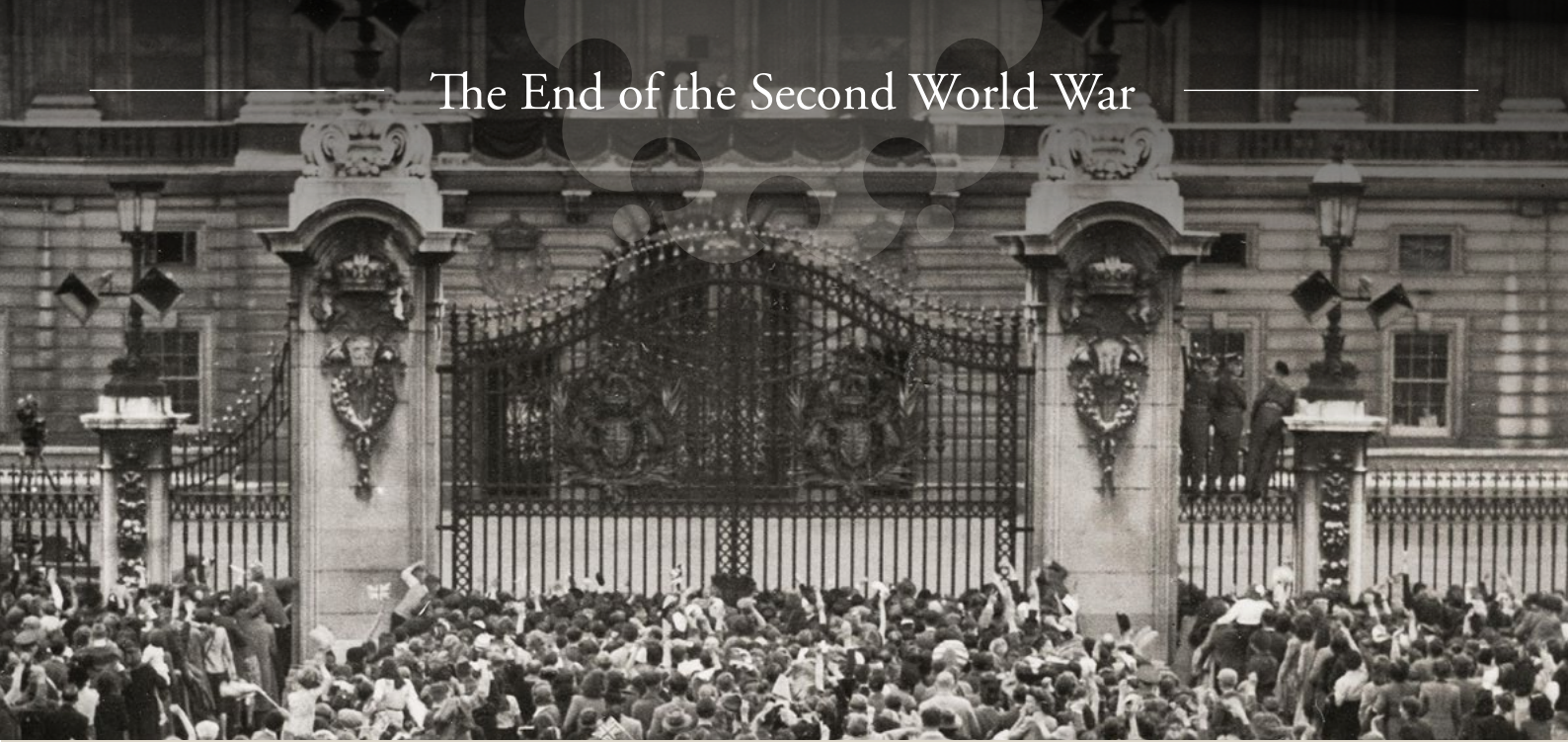

The End of the Second World War



Peace at Last

While VE Day marked the end of the battle in Europe, the war was still far from over.

Following the Allies' victory in May, attention turned to the Far East. Facing formidable opposition from the Japanese, the Allies were left with a grave choice: launch a seaborne invasion at huge human cost or use the atomic capability now at their disposal.

First Hiroshima and then Nagasaki were razed to the ground, forcing Japan to surrender. Prime Minister Clement Attlee announced the news at midnight on 14 August, declaring a two-day public holiday beginning with Victory over Japan (VJ) Day. People joined together in celebration across the country and the rebuilding process could finally begin.

Seventy-five years on, we recall the epic struggle and sacrifice of this generation with a commemorative £5 coin. The coin is available as a limited-edition gold Proof, silver Proof and silver Proof Piedfort edition, alongside a Brilliant Uncirculated edition.

The Royal Mint Around the World

While The Royal Mint is undoubtedly a staple of British culture, its influence spreads far beyond the shores of the United Kingdom.

With more than 1,100 years of history, The Royal Mint is one of the oldest mints in the world. We are also the world's leading export mint, making coins and medals for more than 30 countries around the world each year.

However, in addition to exporting coins, did you know that The Royal Mint has also had a physical presence in a number of countries outside of the UK?

From the mid-1800s to the late twentieth century, The Royal Mint set up a number of branch mints overseas. Here's a brief history of The Royal Mint's branches around the world.

Australia

When gold was discovered in Australia in the mid-nineteenth century, the New South Wales government sought permission to open a Sydney branch of The Royal Mint in 1853. The branch mint opened in 1855 and The Royal Mint would have a physical presence in Australia for over a century. During that time, The Royal Mint operated in Sydney (1855–1926), Melbourne (1872–1968) and Perth (1899–1970).

Prior to 1937, Australian silver coinage had been limited to the florin, shilling, sixpence and threepence. The Coinage Act of 1936 allowed for the introduction of a crown piece, issued the following year. Master tooling for both the obverse and reverse was prepared at The Royal Mint in London before being shipped to the Melbourne branch where the coins were struck.

Canada

While Canadian coinage had been struck in the UK as far back as 1858, Canada's transition from a British colony to independence – coupled with the discovery of gold in the Yukon – led to a Canadian branch of The Royal Mint in 1901. Situated in Ottawa, the branch opened in 1908 and operated until The Royal Canadian Mint was established in 1931.

One of the most revered designs in the history of The Royal Canadian Mint is the 1967 Silver Dollar, commemorating the Canadian Centennial in 1967. The coin features the second definitive portrait of Her Majesty The Queen, who, in addition to serving as the UK's head of state, also holds the title of Queen of Canada.

South Africa

In addition to the Australian locations, The Royal Mint also set up another southern hemisphere site with a branch mint in Pretoria – one of the three capital cities of South Africa. The Pretoria branch was established in 1923 and remained active until 1941. At the height of its production in 1928, the mint struck just over 18 million Sovereign, each with the mint mark 'SA' to differentiate them from the equivalent coins struck back in London.

In 1867, in addition to the gold Sovereigns struck in Britain, those produced by the Sydney branch mint were declared legal tender in the Colony of the Cape of Good Hope. The first locally struck gold coin for general circulation was the pond of 1892 and was produced to the same size as The Sovereign. The pond and the half-pond continued to be struck by the Transvaal until 1900.

Transatlantic Influence

While the US has never played host to an official branch of The Royal Mint, the British influence has been felt indirectly across the Atlantic. It was British engraver George T. Morgan who created the iconic silver Morgan dollar – one of the most famous coins in American history.

Morgan's talents were brought to the attention of the United States Mint in 1876 by Charles Fremantle, Deputy Master of The Royal Mint, who strongly recommended Morgan to the Director of the United States Mint, Henry Linderman. Morgan went on to flourish at the United States Mint, working his way up the ladder to become their Chief Engraver in 1917.

India

Continuing its international expansion across the world, The Royal Mint established another associate mint in India at the tail end of the First World War in 1918. With the German Navy targeting boats transporting gold from South Africa to the UK, the precious metal was instead shipped to India to avoid interception. The Indian branch of The Royal Mint was located in Bombay, now known as Mumbai. It produced Sovereigns as part of the wartime effort, and ceased its operations at the end of the war.

The Indian mints did not come under the direct control of The Royal Mint. Unlike the branch mints, they also made a large amount of their own tooling. The punches and dies for the new reverse design for the British India Rupee introduced in 1911 were therefore prepared at the Calcutta Mint, the design having been chosen from among those submitted by various Schools of Art in India. The Royal Mint in London did, however, prepare an intermediate model of the obverse design by Bertram Mackennal, which was sent out to India.
